<p>Taiwan Youth Project (TYP) aims to study youth's life experiences and development process from a life course perspective. By examining the interplay among three dominant institutions: family, school, and community, TYP focuses on exploring the youth's different growth trajectories and developmental patterns responding to diverse social contexts from adolescence to young adulthood. Youth's life experience is generally accumulated from family, school, and community, and the effects of the interplay among these social institutions are reflected in youth's process of socialization.</p> <p>The project was started in the spring of 2000, with junior high students from Taipei County, Taipei City, and Yi-Lan County's as the study population. In order to examine the effects of Taiwan's educational reforms on the students, TYP takes two cohorts as the study subjects: the 1st year junior high students with an average age of 13 (those taking reformed high school entrance system) and the 3rd year junior high students with an average age of 15 (those taking old high school entrance system). This survey is J1W4S. A total of 2,354 were completed.</p>
